

Hardship Fund

The Cluster wants to establish the best conditions to conduct research. To alleviate the mental load in times of hardship, we support the researchers experiencing financial hardship, e.g. due to health-related or family reasons or who need flexible working conditions.

What is funded?

Hardship support for researchers who experience financial hardship, e.g. due to health-related or family reasons or who need flexible working conditions

Which type of funding is granted?

- An extension (or a top-up) of the researcher's current position for a maximum of three months
- Funds for student assistants to support the applicant's research
- Up to 150 hours pro applicant pro year for student assistants to achieve flexible working conditions for applicants with family duties

Who can apply?

All members and affiliated members (without tenure) of the Cluster "The Politics of Inequality".

How to apply?

Please fill out the application form below. Please note that the supporting documents to verify the hardship situation need to be submitted with the application. Also, the application must clarify that no other funding opportunities are available.

Applications are accepted at any time throughout the year. The Executive Board will review applications continuously. Funding decisions are made continuously so funds can be made available quickly.
